Spelling/Phonics-Field Trip

We had no spelling words this weekl Students worked on creating Thank you letters for Horicon Marsh and Waldvogel's Farm. We had a great time on our field trip learning about habitats, creating a food web and examining the creatures we found in the pond. Students also had fun at the pumpkin farm picking out a pumpkin and exploring all the different activities they had for us to do!

Workshops/Grammar

We had so much fun doing workshops together this power as a class and completed a pumpkin story map together. We talked about story elements such as setting, problem, and solution. We reviewed short and long vowel sounds and ways to make these sounds (magic e, two vowels 'walking', etc) We then shorted words on pumpkins to show we know the difference between short and long vowels when we have a particular province.

and wrote a 'feelings' poem about the change in seasons. During Grammar we reviewed all types of nouns with a fun Smartboard game.

Religion

We remember that Lois Ehlert loves
to incorporate nature into her stories. We
connected this story to art this week as we traced
leaves in crayon and added color using a wax
resist process with watercolor paints.

Science/Social Studies

For Science Students did a pumpkin experiment. We became scientists and made predictions about our pumpkin, (how many pounds we thought it weighed, how tall we thought it was, how big around, how many lines it had and if we thought it would sink or float). After making our predictions we, we found out the actual results to each question. Check out your child's pumpkin sheet to see how well we predicted.

This week we introduced types of communities in Social Studies, we discussed what a city is, what a town is and how farms are usually found in the country. We talked about how these places look like and sound like.

Students also created a "me on the map" where they located what continent, what country, what state and what city they lived in.

Math

This week in math we talked about the days during the week and how Monday-Friday are weekdays and Saturday and Sunday are considered weekend days. We picked our favorite day of the week and made a class picture graph... Ask your child what day of the week had the most students and which had the least.

We continued to practice our math facts (adding o, 1, 2 and double facts).
